### **Steve Glanfield, Organiser:**

"From a sleepy members club with tired old boats, one not very straight slalom course and no ramp when I first arrived at OWSC, I recruited a fantastic team who assisted me in progressively improving the site to a point where we have two tournament capable slalom courses and a switchable ramp. It was disappointing not to be able to hold the Nationals here in 2020 thanks to the pandemic, but it's made us even more determined to put on a great show this year."

### **Freddie Winter, 2017 World Champion & 2 x Masters Champion:**

"In 2013 I needed a place to train before my first World Championships at the end of the year. Having known Steve since I was a little kid I knew he'd look after me. After some serious training together for those last months going into the late October cold I ended up on the podium. After that I never left; Oxford has been my home base for skiing while in the UK ever since and Steve has been a massive part of three more World Championship medals. Every year I pass through a great many ski lakes but Oxford has a special mix of top level skiing facilities and a lovely communal club feel. I feel extremely lucky for all OWSC has given me."

### **Claire Ellis, IWWF Female Disabled Skier of the Decade, with more than 20 world titles:**

"It's great to finally be recognising adaptive skiers as just another category rather than a different sport. We still do tricks, slalom around buoys and hit big red! I'm looking forward to skiing, judging and coaching at the Nationals."

### **Warrant Officer Matt Larkin, current RAF slalom, jump & overall champion:**

"I joined the RAF at 16 and am still there at 52. My dad used to ski and was chairman at Theale for a while so that's how I got into it. I am based at RAF Brize Norton and ski with Steve here at Oxford. I'm still on the water despite numerous injuries including a broken ankle, toe, foot, ruptured biceps tendon and stomach muscles, among many others. I still have more I wish to achieve in the sport."

FoT was formed at the end of 2016 with the aim of raising funds to support elite skiers and the development of the next generation of competitive water skiers.

The main fund raising initiative was the launch in January 2017 of the FoT 200 Club Lottery.

54 monthly prize draws later and along with some other fund raising FoT has so far achieved a total amount of over £165,000 and after prize monies this means £118,000 to support our sport.

50% of the funds raised goes to supporting elite athletes who go to World and European Championships. The other 50% to various development activities such as "Development Days", acquisition of loan equipment and Youth Squad Training.

A lottery ticket costs £25 per month and 32.5% of the income is paid back in 4 monthly prizes. So far 178 prizes have gone to 85 different winners. Look out for our gazebo in the Trade Village and come and say hello.
